

Jesus summoned the Twelve and began to send them out in pairs giving them authority over the unclean spirits. And he instructed them to take nothing for the journey except a staff - no

bread, no haversack, no coppers for their purses. They were to wear sandals but, he added, "Do not take a spare tunic." And he said to them, "If you enter a house anywhere, stay there until you leave the district. And if any place does not welcome you and people refuse to listen to you, as you walk away shake off the dust from under your feet as a sign to them." So they set off to preach repentance, telling people to change their lives and turn back to God. And they cast out many unclean spirits, and anointed many sick people with oil and cured them.




READ & REFLECT! Listen & Learn with Jesus, the Word!

Imagine you are here with Jesus. What can you see? How do you feel? What does it make you think about?

"Listen carefully, and attend with the ear of your heart." St Benedict - Patron of Europe (Feast Day 11th July)

Listening is a sign of real love - it's a powerful way of showing that we care. Listening to the right people and the right messages is important for us and for our children. Ask your child if they know someone who is a really good listener. Who does your child like to listen to? Do they know people who speak with kindness and love, and want good things for them and others? It may help your child if you give them an example of your own.



It is important for us to listen if we are to learn and grow in wisdom. What do you think are the best ways that we can listen to Jesus through the coming summer holidays? Perhaps we can: remember to have quiet times in prayer when we wake up, throughout the day, or at bedtime – just for listening to God as He speaks to our heart; go to Church together; read the gospels in next week's Wednesday Word Summer Special throughout the summer holidays.
